War Commemorative Issue: Dec. 8, 1942.

 - a. deep green
 - b. yellow-green
 - c. deep olive-green
 - d. Broken Japanese character.

Executive Commission Commemorative Issue: Jan. 23, 1943.

- Co 3. 2c on 8c bright carmine-red
 - a. Additional "Hook" on Japanese character.
 - b. Broken Japanese character (NOT in every sheet).
- Co 4. 5c on 1p dull sepia
 - a. grav-sepia
 - b. Misshaped "3" of "23" (NOT in every sheet).
 - c. Two dots instead of one above the Japanese sign for "N" (Very scarce as this error was apparently early corrected on the plate and as nearly all copies already printed were removed from the sheets)

Second Bataan Issue: May 7, 1943 (printed in Japan).

So far only 74 mint copies are known to exist. The remaining 26 copies (of the 100 subject sheet) seem to have been used for F. D. covers or postage and none of them have — to our knowledge — been traced as yet.
